Present Continuous	S+is/am/are+Ving	For activities happening around now (not necessarily at this moment), indicating a temporary situation that started recently and will continue.	currently, at the moment, this week/month
Present Perfect Simple	S+has/have+V3 (past participle)	For <b>finished actions</b> with a result/effect visible in the present, or for experiences.	just, yet, ever, never, so far
